Dear Parents/ Carers

I recently updated you on the temporary pause of confirmatory PCR tests. As a reminder, you are only asked to take a follow up PCR test, after a positive LFD test, if you:

- wish to claim the Test and Trace Support Payment
- have been advised to take a PCR test because you are in a clinically vulnerable group
- have been advised to do so as part of a research or surveillance programme
- have received a positive day 2 LFD after arriving into the UK

If anyone has any of the main symptoms of COVID-19, you are strongly advised to take a PCR test, not an LFD test. If someone with symptoms has already taken an LFD test for any reason and the result is positive, they do not need to take a follow-up PCR test, and will then be required to follow the self isolation rules in the link at the end of this letter.

There will be further changes made to self isolation rules from Monday the 17th January 2022.

From this date, people with COVID-19 in England can end their self-isolation after 5 full days, as long as they test negative on day 5 and day 6.

It is crucial that people isolating with COVID-19 wait until they have received 2 negative rapid lateral flow tests on 2 consecutive days to reduce the chance of still being infectious.

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The first test must be taken **no earlier than day 5** of the self-isolation period, and the second must be taken the following day. If an individual is positive on day 5, then a negative test is required on day 6 and day 7 to release from isolation.

It is essential that 2 negative rapid lateral flow tests are taken on consecutive days and reported before students return to school, if leaving self-isolation earlier than the full 10-day period.

For instance, if an individual is positive on day 5, then a negative test is required on both day 6 and day 7 to release from self-isolation, or positive on day 6, then a negative test is required on days 7 and 8, and so on until the end of day 10 at which point no further LFD tests are required.
